Thanks to Your Parternship

With your support, Escuela de Guadalupe allocated over \$1.4M in student scholarships, benefiting 177 students spanning from Pre-K to 8th grade during the 2022-2023 academic year. In the Barnum neighborhood where Escuela is located, over 28% of the families grapple with poverty, and the median household income is \$42,719. Your investment in Escuela is instrumental in guaranteeing that the school's excellent program stays within financial reach for families in the local community.



In the academic year 2022-2023, Escuela catered to a diverse community of **209 students** hailing from **14 countries** and residing in **38 distinct zip codes** throughout the Denver metro.

The student body comprised of 81% of individuals who identified as Hispanic.



Fifty percent of students at Escuela for the academic year 2022 - 2023 were eligible for the National School Lunch Program, signifying that their families faced challenges in consistently meeting essential needs such as food, transportation, housing, and healthcare.
